Cross Country is the fastest growing fall sport in New York State. It's growing at McQuaid, and the results of the season verify it. Under Coach Robert J. Bradley, the harriers met 105 schools in invitational competition and defeated 72 of them. They wound up the season with a .686 percentage, surpassed only by the '59 team.

In the opening day meet at Utica, McQuaid placed 13th in a group of 30 schools. Our top man was Mike Connor, who finished 8th. The J.V.'s placed 9th out of 32 schools.

Following this fine start, Mike Connor won the Alfred-Almond Invitational on Columbus Day, and Paul Troskosky placed 15th among 77 harriers. McQuaid came in third in a field of 8 schools.

Another high point in the season came when all three teams shipped to Oswego for the Palladium Invitational. In gale force winds and freezing rain Brad Jones led the Knights to 6th place of 19 entries. Frank Eismon and Dick Lenhard contributed a 22nd and 27th, respectively. The J.V.'s came in third out of 13 teams, as Henry Hinz was 8th for McQuaid. Again the Frost made a good showing, led by Abbott and Valby at 9th and 11th. The pages placed 6th in a field of 10.

On the third of November a champion McQuaid team walked off with the honors in the annual Diocesan Championship at Watkins Glen. Mike Connor led the teams to victory over three other schools, as he won the race and set a new course record.
