

Favorites dominate sectional x-c

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Green Lakes' lovely golf course has long been known as one of the best tests in Central New York. The cross country course, brand new this year over the same breathtaking piece of land, will quickly earn the same reputation in the harrier world.

And just as the cream generally comes to the top on a great golf course, all of the pre-race team and individual favorites ran true to form in yesterday's Section Three Cross Country Championships.

Corcoran, winners of five large-school invitationals this fall breezed to the Boys Class A title, amassing 55 points to easily outleg New Hartford's 81 point total. Central New York Cities League individual champion Craig Kinney covered the hilly, three-mile course in 17:22, 12 seconds ahead of Onondaga High School League champ Dave Elster of Jamesville-DeWitt.

The rest of the scorers for John Hohm's Cougars: Jim Scarbrough (fourth), John Serrao (13th), Ed O'Brien (16th) and Steve Loretz (22nd).

Nottingham, which had edged Corcoran in the CNYCL championships at LeMoyne, had an easier time of it in winning the Class B race, totaling 51 points to runnerup Camden's 93.

John Muller paced the Bulldogs with a second place finish behind JFK-Utica's Ed Briggs (17:30).

Onondaga Central, a surprisingly easy OHSI winner last Tuesday at LeMoyne, made it four straight Class C titles, again with astonishing ease. The race for second was won by Sauquoit Valley with 93 points, 59 big ones behind Bill Donnelly's Tigers.

In the girls races, Baldwinsville and Skaneateles romped, as expected in Class A and B respectively.

The Lady Bees added the Class A title to their recent overall OHSI triumph, their 55 point total was ahead of runnerup

Liverpool's 102. OHSI champ Connie Riegelmann crossed finish line first again; her time was 20:17.

The Lakers, second to B'ville at LeMoyne, scored a day's low 27 points with Emily Wood (first at 20:26) and Mary Stoner (4th) receiving strong support from Chris Kimball, (fifth), Laura Miller (6th) and Mary Mercurio (12th).

The winning teams (one per class), plus top seven individuals, are assured of berths in Saturday's intersectionals, also at Green lakes. Section Three will make some noise there.
