York Central won its third straight Section 5 Class B-C cross country title yesterday, overcoming East Rochester's 1-2 finish in the Section 5 championships at Stuart Park in Newark.

York finished with 69 points to 113 for East Rochester and 204 for Addison Central. It was the fifth sectional title in six years for York, which earlier this season had its long winning streak in dual meets snapped at 104.

Canandaigua won the Class A Boys' title and Fairport won the Class AA boys' team championship. In the Girls' Class B race, Penn Yan captured first, while Rush-Henrietta Sperry won the Girls' Class A title. 17

Brewer outlasted Glavin by nine seconds, finishing with a time of 16:30. Bagley won the Class B-C race in 16:24.7 while leading ER to the Class B team title. Fairport won the Class AA team title, led by a fourth place finish by Bruce Lokly and a seventh place finish by Jerry Davis.

Cross Country Title

Aquinas senior Paul Callens ran away from the field to win the City-Catholic League's individual cross country championships yesterday at Cobbs Hill.
