

Glavin 12th in A

Bagley and Kelly second in states

SYRACUSE — Scott Bagley of East Rochester finished second in the boys' Class C race and Anita Kelly of Rush-Henrietta Sperry finished second in the girls' Class A race in yesterday's state high school cross country championships at Green Lakes State Park.

Bagley finished his race in 17:36, the fastest time by any Section 5 runner in the meet. But he still finished 23 seconds behind Mark Beauchamp of Tupper Lake, Section 7, who won the Class C title in 17:13, a record for the 5,000-meter course.

In the first race of the meet, Craig Kinney of Syracuse Corcoran set the course mark of 17:18 to take the Class A individual title, only to have it broken by Beauchamp, who won the boys' race in the Hannibal Invitational earlier this season.

Kelly, a sophomore who was sixth last year, finished in 20:11. Sue Girard of Maine-Endwell, Section 4 won in 19:56. Other top finishers were Anne Baitsholts of Fairport, 17th and Liz Tabor of Penfield, 38th. Seven of last year's top eight finishers returned, except defending champion Beth Dwyer of Fairport, now at Auburn University.

In the Class B girls' race, Lisa Polzinetti of Mynderse Academy finished ninth in 21:20 and Vickie Brown and Desi Burgos of Waterloo were 17th and 37th.

York Central School, a perennial high finisher in the Boys' Class C Team scoring, finished 13th out of 14 schools with 256 points. Onondaga of Section 3 won with 74 points. Mark Layland was York's top runner, finishing 29th in 18:36. Earl Lubanski of York was 85th.

East Rochester was 11th in Class C team scoring with 243.

In Class B, Scott Banner of Brockport finished sixth, Todd Lindsley of Penn Yan finished 12th, and Andy Entingh of Wayne Central finished 32d. Canandaigua finished seventh in team scoring with 164 points. Jeff Coons was Canandaigua's top runner, finishing 49th.

Section 5's top individual finisher in Class A was Peter Glavin of McQuaid, who finished 12th. Bruce Likly of Fairport was 23rd. Fairport was 11th in team scoring with 225 points.

Corcoran of Syracuse scored an upset by winning the Class A team title with 61 points. Favored Walt Whitman of Section 11 was a disappointing fifth with 132. Whitman's bus left before the race started with most of the team's cleats still aboard.

Whitman's runners used sneakers on the course, which was muddy because of rain late Friday and early yesterday, and finished far off their normal times. Pat Jennings of Whitman, who used cleats, finished second behind Kinney.

EISENHOWER INVITATIONAL: McQuaid runners finished first in three of the four races at the 10th annual Veterans Day cross country meet at Eisenhower College in Seneca Falls.

Dave Hoak won the senior race with a time of 16:45 over a 3-mile course, P.K. Brimstein defeated the juniors with a 16:21 time and sophomore Tom Warth won the sophomore division with 16:05. No team scoring was kept.

Athena gymnasts triumph

Greece Athena virtually wrapped up the Monroe County League West Division girls' gymnastics title yesterday with an 81.05-80.65 victory over Churchville-Chili at Athena.

Athena, 3-0 in the league and 4-0 overall, has two league meets remaining. The Trojans and Churchville-Chili (2-1) were considered the best teams in their division this year.

Tracy Smith of Churchville-Chili captured all-around honors with 31.70 points. She took first place in all four individual events. Her scores were 8.45 in floor exercise, 8.05 in vaulting, 7.7 in uneven bars and 7.5 on balance beam.

Athena's Lisa Day finished second in all-around scoring and second in the four individual events.

MORE GIRLS' GYMNASTICS: Brighton (6-0) set a Monroe County League record for high team score, defeating Irondequoit at Brighton, 95.10-62.85. The previous record was 94.00, set by Brighton in its opening meet.

Kathy Matthews captured all-around honors with 33.20 points, followed by freshmen Caren Cook with 31.3 and Wendy Wheaton with

champion Penny O'Brien, was first in 5:54.1 to break its previous record of 6:00.9 set last season. Franklin's boys' double four-lap team of Edgar Brown, Vince Stevens, Alonzo Perkins and Leroy Dixon tied the meet record of 3:40, set last year by Monroe.

Fairport finished second for the second straight year, totaling 42 points. Sweet Home of Section 6 was first with 50 points.

The local individual winners were Pete Glavin of McQuaid, who finished the 3,200-meter run in 9:33.8; Tom Sayler of Fairport with a 6-2 high jump; Mike Roberts of Fairport with a 5.9 in the 40-meter high hurdles; and Dan Davis of Fairport, who went 20-5¼ in the long jump.

Andy Hilburger of Sweet Home set a meet and field house record in the pole vaulting, clearing 14-9. The previous record, set last year, was 14-0.
