There were just two items Franklin Academy Cross Country Coach Bob Fraser couldn't control Saturday for the 32nd Annual Howard B. Intersectional Wescott State Cross Country Meet held at the Malone Golf Club...the weather and the East Aurora team of Section

The weather, unlike four years ago when the meet was held in Malone under near perfect conditions, began to deteriorate late Friday night when snow flakes started falling and by morning had turned the course into a blanket of snow with flurries continuing throughout the entire meet.

As for the Buffalo area team from East Aurora, the team that had nosed Coach Fraser's Huskies out by only nine points in the Malone Invitational on Oct. 17, it was a repeat performance, only this time its margin of victory was even closer, with just four points separating the two schools.

The final tally showed East Aurora the team winner with 85 points in the Boys B event, the Huskies of Section 10 in second with 89. And just one point behind to take third place honors with 90 points was Pearl River of Section 2.

While the Huskie boys were nosed out in their bid to claim the State B crown, the girls of Coach Anne Ray, who

was co-coordinator of the meet with Fraser, wound up with third place laurels in the 11 school field.

It was Pearl River of Section 6 taking first place with 58 points, JFK Somers of Section 5 second with 98 and FA's Section 10 entry in third with 121 points.

The Class B boys and girls Sectional titles both went to Section 9. Section 10's boys took second while its girls were 10th.

Looking at the boys race from man individual standpoint it was FA's Marc Gosselin leading the Section 10 runners by taking fifth in 18:10.0, just 58.8 seconds behind the first place finisher Mike Collins of Rye (Section 1) who took the individual crown in 17:54.2 for the best time of the day.
