### McQuaid edges Aquinas to stretch streak to 110

McQuaid, ranked 10th in the New York State Sportswriters Association poll, won its 110th consecutive cross country dual meet and handed Aquinas its first City-Catholic League loss of the year yesterday, 20-35, at Cobbs Hill.

**Brian Rapp** was first to finish the three miles (16:02) for McQuaid (5-0 in Division 1), which placed four runners in the top five. Monroe (5-0) remained unbeaten in Division 2 with a 21-34 victory over Edison (2-3).

Penfield (18-1) clinched the Monroe County Division 1 crown with a quadrangular meet victory at Genesee Valley Park. **Tim LeTouzel** of Brockport was first over the three-mile loop (15:25) and **John Wiltse** led the Chiefs (15:58).

Churchville-Chili (19-0) ended its season as the only undefeated Monroe County team in a quad meet at Webster Park, taking its second straight Division 3 title. **Greg House** (16:58) completed the 3.1-mile course first, followed 10 seconds later by teammates **Steve Stellwagen** and **Andy Coots**.

Genesee Region: Oakfield-Alabama, led by **Mike Kingsley** (16:30), boosted its record to 5-0, beating Wheatland-Chili, 19-41, in a dual meet at the loser's course.
