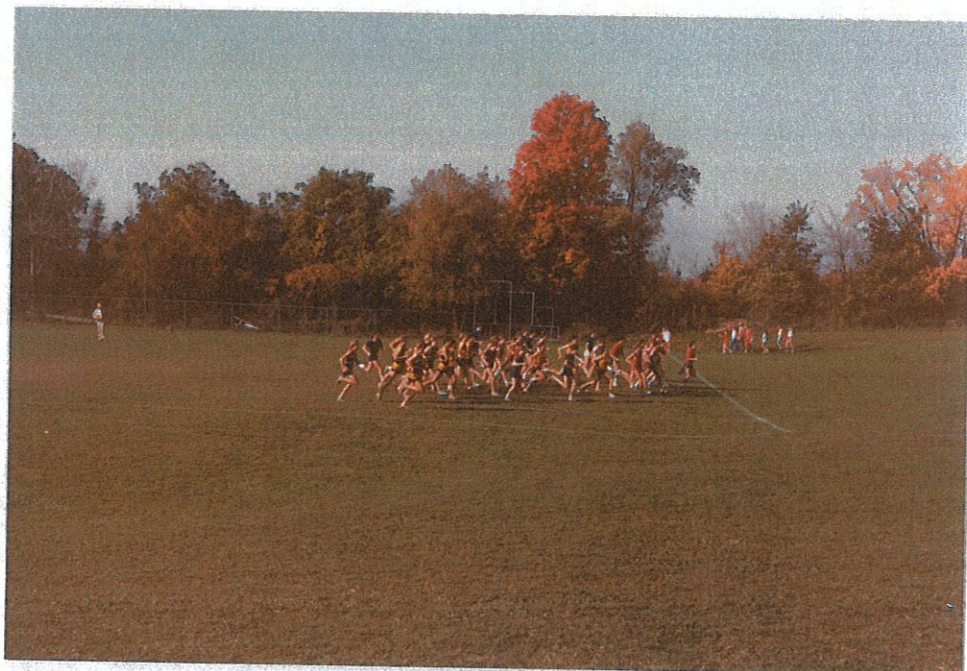

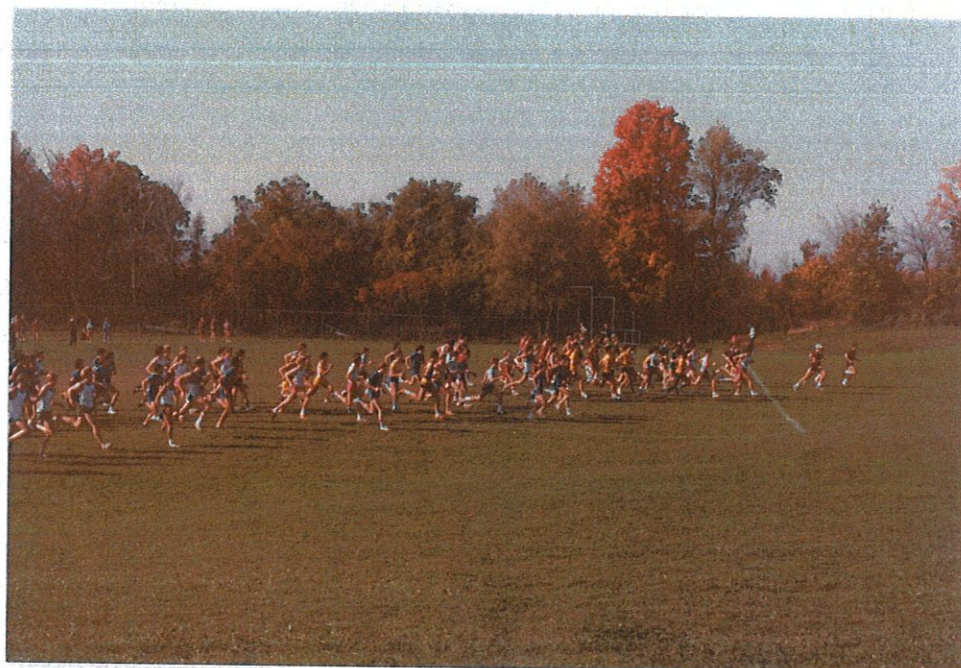

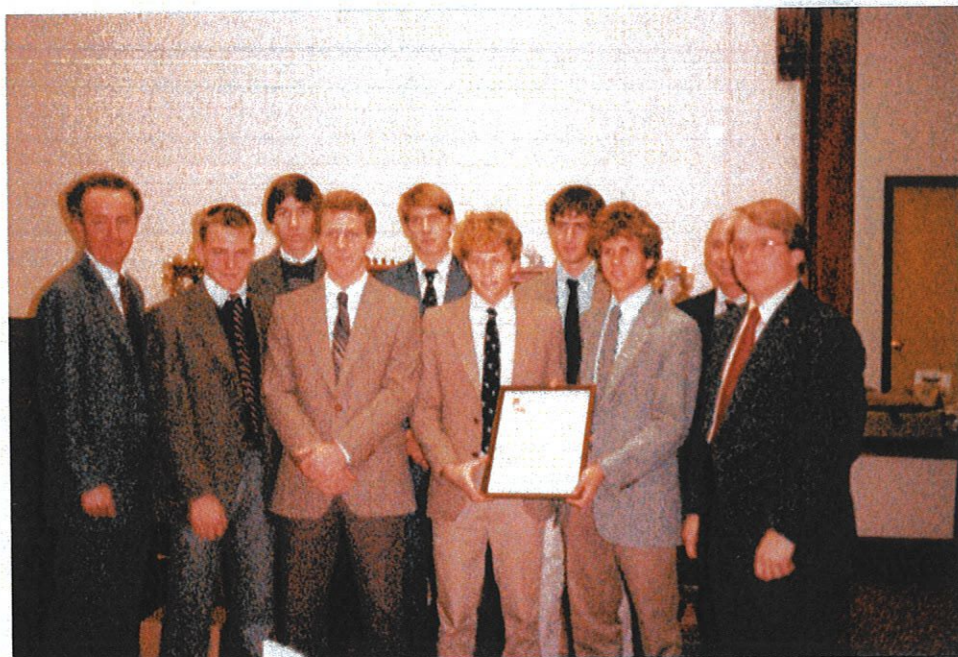

A No. 1 run for Kisner, Victor in sectionals

Waterloo freshman pulls away to win

NEWARK — For Waterloo freshman Janet Kisner, the Section 5 cross country championship was a chance to restore her pride, wounded twice last week. For the girls' team at Victor, it was a chance to impress people, something that wounded legs nearly prevented — and still could.

Both succeeded yesterday at Stuart Park, defending their Class B individual and team titles, respectively.

Also defending its title, in its third and very final 1984 showdown with Brighton, was Class AA champion McQuaid, winner of a close (40-47) race with the Barons. Kisner's race wasn't close.

Last week, at the Wayne-Finger Lakes Championship, the 14-year-old finished an unexpected third in the individual race. Sodus' Julie Darling toured the 3.1-mile course 12 seconds ahead of her. Marion's Becky Gallivan also defeated Kisner.

The prevailing opinion was that Kisner, considered one of the area's

finest runners, had become so concerned about Gallivan that she let Darling get away. Not so.

"Last week, after not making the volleyball team, I was really disappointed," she said. "It hurt me a lot. Today, I was really concerned because of last week. I just went out as fast as I could."

She took a lead of about 2½ seconds over Gallivan at the half-mile point and then swapped places with her after the race was a mile old. That's when the runners in the combined B-C race entered the wooded portion of the course.

"We went up the hills (in the woods) and Becky just dropped back," Kisner said. The lead was 20 seconds at that point and Kisner, though breathing hard — partly because she had a case of "the bug" that nearly kept her out of the meet — stretched it to 45 seconds after 2½ miles. From there, it was an easy finish and a time of 19:55.3 in the 3.1-mile race.

Darling and Gallivan finished one-two in Class C. Hilton's Sue Parkhurst was second in Class B.

Next up for Kisner — as well as for the top team and first four individuals in each class — is Saturday's intersectional meet at Saratoga State

Park, near Albany. Kisner already knows her goal.

"I want to be in the top three at the states because I only missed it by three seconds last year," Kisner said of her Section 5-leading finish at Poughkeepsie as she accepted congratulations from her family.

Her aunt was so pleased with the newest triumph that she promised to bake a pan of lasagna, one of the Kisner's favorite dishes, for the two-time champion.

It wasn't lasagna that got the Victor girls going. Would you believe it was hot dogs? Perhaps trying to reduce the sting of a slightly chilly day, some of the Blue Devils grabbed a snack about twenty-five minutes before starting time.

It worked. Victor outdistanced second-place Newark, 26-59.

"That's about the first time this year we've had our top five runners out there at the same time," said Coach Mark Reissig. "Because we've been hurt, we haven't been able to put together too many strong meets."

The injured included Karen Griffith, who strained a leg muscle last week and Emily Hancock, who was

in only her fourth race of the season after straining some tendons. Yesterday, they finished third and sixth. However, seventh-place runner Lesley Nelson may be added to the list of the running wounded.

The same woods that helped Kisner, hindered Nelson. She stumbled and fell shortly after ascending a steep hill. She suffered cuts below both knees and, by the time she crossed the finish line, a pretty substantial amount of blood had worked down to her socks.

The sophomore said she was OK, but the young team really knows it can't afford to lose any more runners if it's going to make a strong showing at the state meet.

Other teams that, by virtue of their victories, get to worry about injuries and mishaps this week are the Brighton (Class AA) and Sodus (C) girls and the boys from Hilton (A), Sodus (B) and South Seneca (C).

The list of individual champions, besides Kisner and Darling, winning spots at the state meet: Brighton's Stacy Prey (Class A girls), Tim Heinle (Brighton, AA boys), Al Mullan (Hilton, A boys), Scott Waite (Pembroke, B boys) and Don Kent (South Seneca, C boys).
