Southall, a senior from Rush-Henrietta Sperry who is in South Bend, Ind., on a college visit to Notre Dame, is one of seven football players selected. Southall, Canandaigua junior quarterback Bill Scharr and East Rochester senior tackle Chris Schojan are repeat winners.

Joining them are fellow All-Greater Rochester picks. Tim Sharp and David Der Cola of Clyde-Savannah, and Mike Scott of McQuaid. Quarterback Bob Gibbs, a senior who guided Fairport to the Section 5 Class AAA title, also will be recognized.

Prey, a senior from Brighton who is one of just 32 female qualifiers running today in the national final of the Kinney Cross Country Championships in San Diego, is another repeat award winner. The all-state selection was one of five runners named.

She is joined by Section 5 champions Janet Kisner of Waterloo and Tim Heinle of Brighton, and state federation champ Dave Redding of Dansville. McQuaid's Rob Smillie also is recognized for guiding his team to a state championship and the No. 1-ranking in the state sports writers poll.

Kisner, a freshman, was the youngest athlete ever honored when she earned an inaugural Sports Excellence Award last fall.

Bills, the Monroe County League's swimmer of the year, was a state champion in the 100-meter butterfly and a member of her school's two-time state champion 400 freestyle relay team. Bills is joined by fellow repeat winners Maureen Cleary of Irondequiot and Anna Martens of Brighton. Each is a senior who doubled as a Section 5 champion this season.

Lisa Scott, a senior from Rushford, is one of seven girls' soccer players being recognized. Scott is Section 5's all-time leading scorer with 132 goals in six varsity seasons.

She is joined by All-Greater Rochester selections Jill Decker of Williamson, Diane Perna of Greece Arcadia, Sue Confer of Hilton, Tammy DiCesare of Cardinal Mooney, Lisa Caraccilo of Mynderse and Cassie Jordan of Mendon. Caraccilo and Jordan are the only underclassmen in the group.

Harley-Allendale-Columbia tennis star Tina von Kessel also is an underclassman. The two-time Section 5 champion is a freshman who is undefeated in area competition over the past two seasons.

Rounding out the area's premier 32 are field hockey sensations Laurie Blanchard of Webster and Wendy VanThof of East Rochester. A pair of Monroe County League all-stars, Blanchard guided her team to a second straight Section 5 title, while VanThof took her team to the semifinals of the state tournament.
