

The 21st Annual McQuaid Invitational Cross-Country Meet will have almost 3,500 competitors. We expect that over 800 of them will be boys and girls coming from out-of-state and Canada and needing overnight accommodations the Friday before the meet. We rely on a whole lot of McQuaid families being willing to host these young runners. Can you help? Here's how it works:

Pick up the runners at McQ. between 7:30 and 9:30 P.M. on Fri., Sept. 27th. (They'll already have eaten dinner.)
 Give them a light breakfast on Saturday and bring them back to McQ. or directly to Genesee Valley Park, whichever is easier.

Many of the runners will have sleeping bags, so a carpeted room can readily serve as a sleeping area. Don't feel that you have to have a guest room. And other McQ. families in your area can help with transportation if that's a problem on either Fri. or Sat.

You can have either boys or girls or both, and you can have a mixture of coaches and runners, especially if you'll need transportation help. We will try to match the ages of your guests with those of your teenagers, e.g, sophs with sophs, as much as possible.

If you're able to help out with our impromptu hotel operation, you can send the reply form back by mail or via your son sometime before Sept. 13th. Just ask him to leave it in my mail box in the principal's office. Thanks!

Last year, your generous response took care of 756 guests. Some hotel!

Dear parents and friends of McQuaid,

Thanks to your generous response we've been able to come up with the 664 overnight spots for this Friday. Needless to say, that's done wonders for my morale. You're terrific!

This letter is just to confirm our acceptance of your offer and to pass on a few more details.

First, so far as pickup is concerned, almost all of the runners will be at McQuaid by 6:30 for a spaghetti dinner in the cafeteria. Leaving time for them to eat and stretch a bit, I'd say 7:00 is a good time to start picking your guests up. No need to come right at that time -- anytime between then and 9:00 will be fine. That way there won't be a big crush of parents waiting at any one time.

We are hoping to streamline our operation this year, so the runner pick-up will be on a first-come, first-served basis. For this reason we are not indicating the exact number of runners or coaches we will assign to you. We will give you no more than the maximum number you indicated you could take. Your exact number will be available at the check-in table on Friday.


Our table will be right in front of the chapel. When you check in there, one of our runners will take you to the classroom where your particular runners are, and you can take them away from there.

In the morning, most runners will want only a light breakfast (the ones running in the afternoon might be an exception) -- something like dry cereal, juice, and toast with jam, or some light pastry. Nothing fried, greasy, or heavy.

The various coaches, depending on the times of their races, will let you know on Friday when they would like their boys to be at McQuaid, or at the park if that is easier for you.

The 42 out-of-state schools who are coming add a dimension to the meet that should make it the best one yet. You're the ones who have made that possible, and I thank you again, for myself, the team, and McQuaid.

Trawitz still chases Prey, though her 'idol' has left

Fairport junior aims to be best runner

Kim Trawitz would like to be Stacy Prey before she grows up.

"She's my idol," the Fairport High School junior said the other day.

Prey, formerly of Brighton and now a record-setting freshman at Penn State, also is Trawitz's barometer in distance running.

"Sometimes I stop and think, 'Stacy did this last year; I want to do this now,' "Trawitz admitted. "She's someone I look up to. Maybe someday I'll be in the same class as her."

Trawitz giggles at the thought.

"I remember when I was a freshman," she recalled, "and Stacy would lap me

(in indoor track). As she was going by she'd say, 'Go Kim.' I'd be, like, 'Wow. I'm getting lapped, but it's OK because it's Stacy.' Anyone else and I would have been mad at myself."

Prey was a state cross country champion last year in her first season of competition. Trawitz, only a sophomore and also running cross country for the first time, finished fifth. She was the next best thing to Stacy Prey in Section 5.

But Prey's graduation does not leave Trawitz alone as the area's best runner.

She will be challenged in cross country by Spencerport sophomore Patti VanDerMallie, Brighton freshman Rachel Hosmer, Webster junior Erika Schwartz, and Penfield's one-two punch of senior Rachel Korn and 11-year-old, seventh-grader Deresa Walters. Among

small-school competition, Waterloo sophomore Janet Kisner is a front runner.

"I expect one of us to take the lead spot for Section 5," the 5foot-6, 101-pound Trawitz said. "It would be nice if I could take it. I think I have a shot at it.'

Fairport Coach Nancy Booth agreed, saying, "Kim is determined to be a state champion as a junior. I think her chances are very, very, very good.

"Someone of Kim's ability doesn't come along every day."

At Fairport it might be once every seven years or so. That's how long it has been since Beth Dwyer ran to a state title.

"Kim's in the same caliber as a

Beth Dwyer," said Booth. But Trawitz dreams of being of the same quality as a Prev.

"You might see that from Kim next year," said Booth.

Trawitz opened this season with a first-place finish at the Newark Invitational. She lowered her time by nearly 25 seconds on the 3.1mile course that will again be the site of the Section 5 championships.

"Barring any unforseen circumstances, like an injury or sickness at the time of the sectionals (Nov. 2), it's very realistic she'll finish first again," said Booth.

"At this point, she's probably the best around," said Penfield Coach Dave Hennessey. "She had a real good summer of training.

Trawitz logged about 500 miles this summer. Included in that mileage is a 10,000-meter run that earned her a silver medal at the Empire State Games.

These days she practices with the boys' B team at Fairport.

"It's kind of challenging," Trawitz said. "I tell my coach, 'I'm

too slow to run with the boys.' But the boys say I'm not.'

Trawitz has been outrunning boys since elementary school. "I would've been labeled a tomboy then," she said.

She entered her first competitive event - the Firecracker Five-Mile Run in Perinton Park — at the age of 11, then took up track in junior high.

"I ran the sprints," Trawitz recalled. "I thought the 800 (meters) was the longest race I'd ever seen."

When she ran the 1,500 indoors as a freshman she said, "It was scary. I was just so surprised I could finish that long a race.'

Now she is accustomed to 14mile workouts.

"It takes a certain individual to participate in this sport," said Booth. "It's not for everybody. You've got to have it inside you to keep going.

A special drive also is needed to become the best.

"I'd like to be the Stacy Prey

now," said Trawitz. "I'd like the younger runners to look up to me. "I guess I'll think big. It never

hurts to think big.'

NOTES: Fairport is regarded as the top team in Section 5 with Trawitz and senior Chris Gaylo leading the way. Gaylo finished ninth in last year's sectional Class A race ... Rounding out the top five are (in order) Webster, Spencerport, Victor and Penfield . . Brighton, which was No. 1 in the state last season with a lineup that included seniors Prev. Jody Dushay, Jennifer Shaver and Stephanie Walsh, is considered the area's sixth best team ... Penfield's Walters was among the "Faces in the Crowd" recently in Sports Illustrated. She was recognized for setting a national agegroup record in the 3,000 (10:13) at The Athletic Congress' National Championships. The Section 5 record in the 3,000 (held by Prey) is 9:36.56.

They'd prefer to be rude running hosts

McQuaid's Knights want to keep team title here

Runners from St. Michael's of Toronto shouldn't be taken in by the southern hospitality they'll again find when they visit Rochester this weekend.

The competition wants something

they've got.

St. Michael's is a three-time defending champion of the McQuaid Invitational, this nation's largest high school-sponsored cross country meet.

But, McQuaid Coach Bob Bradley said the other day, "I think St. Mike's is ripe to be knocked off."

Bradley would know. Not only is he the director of this 21-year-old meet, he also is the man behind the Knights, New York's top-ranked team.

"They're not quite as deep as they've been the last three years," Bradley is

happy to report.

St. Michael's is one of about 160 teams that will be in attendance Saturday at Genesee Valley Park. More than 3,700 runners will compete in 20 races, beginning at 10 a.m.

Many of the competitors are from out of town and quite a few need some-

where to stay tomorrow night, including the St. Michael's seven.

Bradley said "almost 200 McQuaid families" are among the 680 housing spots he located to accommodate runners.

"We have football families and hockey families and no-sport families and alumni families taking people in," he said. "Neighboring schools helped out. Brighton, Victor, Penfield, Webster, Aquinas, Mercy and Gates-Chili are all putting up people.

"It becomes a big social get-together. Families bring their runners (to the park) and then root

for them."

Despite the well-wishers, St. Michael's will be running for its Class AAA life when the seeded race for large-school teams begins

at 3:35 p.m.

The state's No. 4 team, Fairport, No. 20 St. Anthony's of Section 11 (Suffolk County), highly-regarded Monsignor Farrell of Staten Island and Upper Canada Collegiate of Toronto will join McQuaid in a 15-team field Bradley called "formidable."

McQuaid was a runner-up last year with a team that went on to win state and Jesuit titles.

"If last year's team had run the way it should have we would have won," said Bradley. "It was just not a good day for us."

But, the veteran coach added, "There's no reason why we can't

(win) this year.

"We have better strength up front. We only had one runner (graduate Rob Smillie, who finished 12th) in the top 25 last year. With Scott Paterson and George Schell we could have two

in the top 10 or 15."

The competition is stiff, however, with a list that includes Binghamton's Geoff Coco (fourth here last year), Erie Prep's Dan Schneider (the runner-up in Class AAA unseeded), Lockport's Kerry Fly (a third-place finisher in the unseeded race), St. Mike's Pete Fonseca (19th last year), Upper Canada's Beau Hatcher (who has run 3,000 meters in 8:40), St. Anthony's Matt Morton and Pat O'Rourke (a pair of 9:25 twomilers), Ohio's state runner-up (Mike Luby) and Pennsylvania's state fourth-place finisher (Chris Rauber).

"This field is definitely stronger than last year's," said Bradley.

Welcome to Rochester, St. Michael's.

NOTES: Pittsford and Penfield, Section 5's sixth- and eighth-rated teams, are in the Class AAA unseeded race that begins at 2:50 p.m. Al Smith of Penfield is one of the favorites for individual honors ... Victor, which is considered the fourth best team in the area, and No. 10 York will contend for the Class A seeded title at 11:10 a.m. with three of Pennsylvania's perennial powers - Blue Mountain, Oswayo Valley and North East. Last year's runner-up, Adam Grenito of defending champion Blue Mountain, will be challenged by Victor's Scott Knapp, York's Steve Schultz and Bath's Dan Stenta ... In the Class AA seeded race at 1:10 p.m., defending champion East Aurora will face Cleveland's Benedictine and Cardinal LeGer of Brampton,

Ontario. Runner-up Dave Sturgen of Cloverleaf (Ohio) returns.

Reigning Class A champion Milton (Ontario) moves up to Class AA to challenge defending titlist Baldwinsville in the girls' seeded race at 3:10 p.m. Milton's Brenda Steenhof, a senior who set the course record last year (17:11.5) before Brighton graduate Stacy **Prey** eclipsed her mark by 22.3 seconds later in the day, is one of the front runners. She likely will be joined by Baldwinsville's Bonnie Gleeson (third last year) and Terry Mero (fourth), Fairport's Kim Trawitz (seventh) and Brighton's Rachel Hosmer (14th) .. In Class A at noon, Waterloo's Janet Kisner will be the individual to beat and perennial power Chardon (Ohio) could win its fifth team title in seven years.

From a modest start 20 years ago to 'simulation' of state meet today

Nation's largest built by McQuaid's Bradley

Eric Kendrick needed somewhere to run. So his cross country coach at McQuaid, Bob Bradley, called 11 other high schools and invited them to race 21/2 miles through the streets of Brighton.

Twenty years later, the McQuaid Invitational has become the biggest meet of

its kind in the nation.

It may be the largest in the world. "Eric Kendrick was our top runner then," Bradley recalled yesterday. "We wanted to give him a chance to do something in his own backyard."

These days, it gives more than 3,500 runners from 161 schools an opportunity to compete over a three-mile course at

Genesee Valley Park.

"If we have a state caliber team it's good exposure for them running here against other top teams that they don't know," said Coach Bill Kabert of Class AAA seeded champion Central Catholic. "It's good simulation for a state meet."

Central Catholic drove 61/2 hours from Pittsburgh for the seventh straight year. Cloverleaf of Lodi, Ohio, came the farthest — nearly 300 miles — to attend. Teams also arrived from Toronto. Brampton, Kingston and Milton, Ontario.

Only Hurricane Gloria could keep away Loyola of Towson, Md., Monsignor Farrell of Staten Island and St. Anthony's of

Long Island.

In all, 702 runners were put up by area families Friday night and rooted on yesterday during 20 races that attracted more than 1,000 spectators.

"This meet is wonderfully organized. the competition is superb and the crowds are cordial," said Kabert, whose team again stayed overnight with McQuaid's wife Warth family.

The meet was designed originally to show off Kendrick, a three-time Jesuit Saxat cross country champion (and a winner of isse the mile at the Penn Relays) who went on to Maryland State on a scholarship. 10.0

"Brighton (High) had the big meet at the time, but it was suspended that year, and Bradley said. "There wasn't any other in male

vitational in the area."

So, in 1965, Bradley started a new one. OHL Of course, Kendrick won. It is the only smell time a McQuaid runner has triumphed. ade.

"My biggest worry that year was find-shide ing a couple of crates of apples," said Bradley. "Giving out apples after a race that? was the big thing back then.

"It was totally low-key. I have to laugh when I think about that first race."

Within three years the race had out-Bord grown the McQuaid campus and was moved to Rochester Institute of Technologies ogy. RIT served as a host to up to 90 teams until 1972 when Bradley went to the department of parks.

A rainstorm that left RIT's course in a made shambles prompted that move. "They were nice about it," Bradley said, "but you don't want to use school property and leave it like that."

Genesee Valley Park became home to this invitational. In rain and sunshine.

"Here, with the space," said Bradley, "we had room to grow."

And grow the meet did.

This year's edition was the biggest high school-sponsored meet in

the country.

"I know it's bigger than anything in Canada, too," said Bradley, who rents an area of the park for \$80. "I often joke, "This might be the biggest in the world."

Bradley said most schools are drawn to the meet for the competition. "Instead of being scared off, the weaker schools know they can come and run in the unseeded races against their own level (of talent).

"This is a great spectator course, too. You get a lot of crowds all over the course. Most races aren't run that way. The runners usually just go off by themselves.'

Kabert, whose team was a Pennsylvania state runner-up last year, agreed, saying, "This is a wonderful course. You're able to view the

whole race here. It's frustrating for a coach not to be able to see the race."

Especially if that coach has a shot at winning one of the sea-

son's premier races.

"This (invitational) is very much like a state meet," said Bradley, whose defending state champion team finished second behind Central Catholic. "It's tougher some years than a state meet.

"I would say this year's field was just as tough as any we've had here. Possibly it was the toughest."

Bradley does not expect the meet to grow too much more. He is more than satisfied now with the size of the field.

"Just the fact that the people come and when they leave they say, 'Great meet,' " said Bradley, who spends countless hours planning the annual event. "That

makes it worth it."

It was worth starting in 1965 for Eric Kendrick. It is worth even more in 1985 for the thousands of individuals who come to run here again and again.

An 'unbelievable' day

Brighton's Hosmer surprised by big victory

It was difficult for Rachel Hosmer to understand that, with less than a halfmile remaining in her three-mile race, she had an unbeatable lead.

"I knew no one was near me, but everyone was saying I had a 45-second lead, which I couldn't believe," the Brighton freshman said. "After the first half-mile I had broken off from the rest of the field."

It was a clean break, allowing Hosmer to cruise to victory yesterday in the Class AA unseeded girls' race at the 21st McQuaid Invitational cross country meet.

It was one of only three victories by Section 5 runners during the 11 varsity races at Genesee Valley Park, with Sarah Martini of Penn Yan (Class A unseeded) and Harley-Allendale-Columbia's Richard Bolt (A-3 seeded) the other champions.

Area teams fared much better. Martini and her teammates joined five boys' squads — East Rochester, Dansville, Batavia, Brighton and Pittsford — in collecting team trophies.

The day's outstanding showings were by two Canadians among the more than 3,500 runners from 161 schools.

John Gill of Cardinal LeGer in Brampton, Ontario, earned the Steve Prefontaine Memorial Plaque for the day's fastest time (14:43.8), in AA seeded. And senior Brenda Steenhof of Milton, Ontario, who marveled at Stacy Prey's form last year when the Brighton graduate set

the course record, lopped five seconds off the mark (16:44) in AA seeded.

"I just can't believe it," Steenhof said after defeating fellow Canadian Sara Forsdyke of Loyalist Collegiate by 22 seconds. "I wasn't really thinking about the record, just winning.

"Stacy is such a great runner. I wish she had been here this year. I think if I had run with her, I wouldn't have won, but I could have run an even faster time."

Last year, Steenhof and Hosmer both admired Prey's form. From behind.

"I always knew Stacy would be ahead of me," said Hosmer (17:56.9). "With our team I knew I would have someone in front of me, no matter what. Now, it feels unusual for me to be ahead."

The Barons originally were entered with Steenhof in the seeded race, but elected to try the unseeded competition.

"We're not as good as we were last year," Hosmer said after the Barons placed third (258) to Vestal (180) and Bradford, Pa. (252). "It really didn't matter to me. I would have pushed myself just as hard in that race."

Hosmer has a second driving force step-brother Scott Paterson, a McQuaid junior who finished fifth in AAA seeded, the day's most prestigious boys' event.

"He's helped my attitude toward a race, giving me tips about keeping a good stride and relaxing," Hosmer said.

They were able to keep track of each other yesterday, one of the season's few meets in which both are entered.

"Usually, when she races on Tuesdays (in Monroe County League meets). I'm in practice," Paterson said. "We were together last week (at Newark Invitational where Paterson won and Hosmer finished third). It's nice to watch her win a race."


The last two Saturdays have given Paterson, the area's best runner, a chance to evaluate Hosmer's improvement.

"Before, she would get so worked up about a race at the starting line that I thought she wouldn't be able to run," he said. "Now she's more relaxed. She's learning she has to push herself, that she can run with anyone."

That thought was also strengthened in Martini's mind. The absence of Waterloo sophomore Janet Kisner — eighth in the tougher A seeded after winning the unseeded by nearly a minute last year — gave Martini (19:04.5) the incentive to outrun Sodus' Julie Darling (19:26.7).

"I sort of wish she had run in this race, and then again I'm glad she didn't," the sophomore said after collecting her first invitational gold medal. "I led most of the way, and that was a new experience for me. I could sort of tell someone was

behind me, because of the way the crowd cheered, but it's hard to tell how far."

Onondaga on Run For 7th State Title

Only one school in the state has won more boys' state cross country titles than Onondaga High School, but the Tigers are making plans to tie for No. 1 later this fall.

Barring upsets, Coach Bill Donnelly's team figures to achieve its goal of a seventh state crown.

We've had a handful of more outstanding lead runners than we do this year, but I'd say this is the best balanced team I've ever had," said Donnelly.

Donnelly, who has coached the boys' and girls' track and cross country teams at Onondaga since 1967, has seen his boys' teams earn Class C cross country state titles in 1976, 1977, 1979, 1980, 1981 and 1982. On three other occasions -1978, 1983; 1984 — his Tigers placed second at the state meet.

Donnelly, whose cross country teams have beaten 68 straight foes in Onondaga League South competition since 1972, is anxious to end the frustration of the past two

ate crown, they would tie Oss, of Section One, for most state cross country titles. Ossining won all its championships during the 1960s.

Ranked 11th in the state this week, Onondaga leads all Section Three teams in the state poll.

"Onondaga might very well be the best team in the section. They looked very good at Baldwinsville last Saturday," Henninger coach Jerry Riordan said. "For such a small school, Onondaga amazes me because they have an outstanding team every year.

"Small schools usually have off vears after a good class graduates, out Onondaga never seems to have an off year.

At the Baldwinsville Invitational, Onondaga dominated the field. Its top four rupners -- seniors Kevin Van Boden, Vinnie Loffredo, Tom Boughton and sophomore

Dave Boughton - finished in a tie for first place.

The 21 points by the Tigers out-far distanced runner-up Weedsport, which had 82.

Similarly, at the Newark Invitational on Sept. 21, Onondaga placed a trio of runners — Tom Boughton, Loffredo and Van Boden - in a first-place tie.

"I know Beaver River and Norwood-Norfolk are looking to get us," he said. "We have to keep improving, because those two teams seem to be improving every week."

So far this fall, the Tigers are unbeaten, with wins at the New Hartford, Newark, Utica Procter and Baldwinsville Invitationals.

Donnelly said the key to staying undefeated is team balance. He constantly monitors the times of senior Matt Stanton, juniors Bob Crump and Dave Cothran, freshman Bruce Ryan and 13-year-old varsity team member Pat Van Boden, a seventh-grader.

Cross country team scores are obtained by adding the places of a team's first five runners to finish. Crump is the fifth man, but is being pushed by the other four varsity runners.

The Tigers' No. 1 runner is Van Boden, fourth at the Section Three Class C meet last year behind three graduated seniors.

"He should be the section's best runner in Class C this year," said Donnelly. "We don't have anybody as good as some of our No. 1 runners of the past, like Joe Thedford, Rich Surace, Jim Paige or Sid Rhyant. But our top four guys all run under 10 minutes for two miles. and some of the others are closing in on that mark."





The late Loyal D. Greenman, for whom this Cross-Country Meet is named, was a native of Cazenovia, New York. He came to Binghamton in 1923 as a teacher and basketball coach at Binghamton Central High School, and eventually became Athletic Director for the City School System.

Mr. Greenman also served as Director of the Binghamton Recreation Commission where he worked tirelessly in the cause of the city's youth and senior citizens. His efforts were culminated in the establishment of the first Binghamton Senior Citizens Center. In 1961, the Pine Haven Senior Citizens Headquarters was officially dedicated. On May 16, 1976, the new Loyal D. Greenman Senior Citizens Center was dedicated on the site of the Pine Haven building.

In 1951, Mr. Greenman introduced Little League Baseball to Binghamton and in 1965 the Pee Wee Football program was formed.

It is with extreme pleasure that the Binghamton City School District dedicates this meet as a memorial to Loyal D. Greenman.


