

Rochester school wins 2nd cross country title

Rochester McQuaid claimed three of the top 10 positions yesterday and defended its varsity boys' championship at the Loyal D. Greenman Invitational cross country meet at Ely Park Golf Course.

McQuaid tallied 42 points to 92 each by Elmira Southside and Ithaca. Southside, running without two of its standouts, brothers Tony and Andy Robyler, was awarded second place by virtue of its fifth-place finisher coming in ahead Ithaca's No. 5 man.

Southside's Mike Kane was the individual winner with a 15:37 clocking over the hilly three-mile course. Kane ran with the lead group throughout the race, then outkicked eventual runner-up Chris Cusack of McQuaid over the final half mile.

In the varsity girls' competition, Binghamton's Dawn Mullineaux won the individual title in 18:33, six seconds better than runner-up Mary Beth Reilly of Buffalo Sacred Heart. Mullineaux, a junior who earlier won the Southern Tier Ath-

letic Conference championship, finished 28 seconds better than last year's Greenman winner, Binghamton's Linda Benkovic.

The girls' team title went to Elmira Free Academy, whose best finisher was seventh-place Sylvia Stanton.
