An individual title defense in boys' Class C by Harley-Allendale-Columbia's Richard Bolt. His other credentials this season include a championship at the McQuaid Invitational, although vesterday's 55-second victory on the 5,000-meter course was more impressive.

Bolt credits his success to the fact that he trained seriously over the summer for the first time. His routine included weightlifting, cycling and rollerblading (similar to skiing), but only a minimal

amount of running.

"I like to do everything," said Bolt. "I went to a couple of ski camps at Lake Placid last winter with a coach from Sweden. He has a good philosophy: Don't concentrate on one sport until you're out of high school. I like that thinking."

Bolt, 23 other individual qualifiers and six team champions go to Elma Meadows Park in Section 6 (Buffalo area) next week for the New York State Public High School Athletic Association meet.

Winning times in the somewhat warm weather were slower than last year, but Fairport's double brought excitement to what otherwise had been an ordinary day.

The person most excited by it all may have been Fairport boys' Coach Rick Guido, who was a second-place finisher four times by margins of one, three, three and five points - at Rush-Henrietta Sperry but had set his eves on winning this one.

"We talked about just this kind

of thing in August, Guido said of Fairport's twin victories. "We started talking about the boys winning at the Monroe County coaches training camp. We had our kids, some McQuaid kids and some Albion kids. We told our kids it was possible."

Little did he know that the accomplishment would be overshadowed by Smith and Milles, whose duel brought screams of encouragement from spectators over the final 300 yards. Smith was declared the winner in 16 minutes. 59.4 seconds, one-tenth of a second ahead of Milles. Both leaned at the finish line, but neither was sure of the winner.

"I tried (to lean) but I didn't know if it was enough," said Smith, who was seventh last season as a freshman. "First the guy in the (finishers') chute held us up and velled to the judge, 'Who won ?"

The official gave just the answer Smith wanted to hear. Less than a minute earlier, the front-running

withes heard something he had hoped he wouldn't.

"The people on the course were going nuts." the Irondequoit senior said. "I knew he was right there."

By comparison, Smith "coasted" to a seven-second victory in the league invitational last weekend. It was in that same meet that the Fairport girls edged Webster to establish a sense of order to the area rankings. Now, Fairport's internal order has been rattled by Chard. who finished in 19:48.

"I feel really great about it," Chard said of her finish. "I've trained hard and I have a mental (approach) that if I tell myself that I can do it, then I can."

Chard finished behind winner Deresa Walters (also an eighthgrader, 19:12) of Penfield and Webster senior Erika Schwarz (19:36), but one spot ahead of teammate Kim Trawitz, the area's most acclaimed senior. Sue Castor finished ninth to give Fairport three in the top 10.
