Greece Arcadia won the boys small-schools race with Chris Weigand finishing second (16:39) and Mike Child ninth (17:04). Albion's Geoff Sidari was first with a time of 15:55.

Sidari set his pace and took off with the race. "He really ran his race and was in control from the start," Schneider said.

In the large-schools girls race, Fairport finished far above any of the competitors

with 39 points, 41 better than Webster. Every Fairport runner finished in the top 10. The Red Raiders were paced by Nancy Nead's third-place finish (19:36), followed by Melissa Salvman in sixth (20:20), Carrie Cocca (20:35) in eighth and Gail Vosylius

(21:15). Sue Yagielski of Greece Olympia was named the top runner, posting a strong time of 19:10 to capture first place in the large-schools division.

Wendy Bensley finished first (19:21) in the small-schools girls race to pace Honeoye Falls-Lima to its victory. Teammates Amy Bauer finished ninth (21:31), Rebekah Banfield 14th (21:53), Emilie Mahood 15th (21:58) and Melanie Sperry 16th (22:07).
