## After 31 years, it's over

### Aquinas ends McQuaid's dual meet win streak

Aquinas sophomore Kevin Oberst heard the cries from friends and family to keep moving around Cobbs Hill.

About a half-mile from the finish however, Oberst received the spur to the 10th-place finish that clinched a 27-28 Aquinas win and ended McQuaid's cross country dual-meet win streak at 212 on Tuesday.

"I heard a McQuaid kid say 'You pass him and we win' " Oberst said. "He was talking about me.

"I said, 'I'm not going to let that happen.' "

After Oberst hustled to hold off the runner behind him, one of the nation's longest string of victories was over 31 years after it began in 1971.

Christian Brothers Academy of Lincroft, N.J., is the owner of the top dual meet win streak, with more than 250, dating back to 1974.

The father of McQuaid junior Mike Moore was a freshman at the school when the Knights began their streak, which spans a longer period of time than any other.

"I'm proud of everyone



on our team," disappointed Mc-Quaid captain Sunil Narayan said. "There's no blame. That's how it goes sometimes.

"It's been a tough year, but everyone gave it their best."

Aquinas' Dave Hryvniak certainly did. He ran a course-record 16:33, 21 seconds faster than the race run by 1998 McQuaid graduate Joe LaMagna.

"It was a small goal of mine," said Hryvniak, who is considering attending Dartmouth, Princeton, William & Mary, Iona or Butler.

"It's been there forever. I've run this race for four years and it (the team score) has never been that close."

Little Irish teammate Noel Bateman (17:33) finished second overall.

"I was trying to get through the race and stay ahead of them," Bateman said. "Yeah, I looked back a couple of times."

Bateman, along with coach Ron Zimmarino, turned back toward the field to watch Aquinas runners Brett Cumbo (17:53), Tim Calnon (18:15) and Oberst come in 6th, 8th and 10th.

"Through the year we've compared times and we've matched up with them," Calnon said, referring to McQuaid, "We've been counting down the days."

The Aquinas team members, and more than a few anxious parents, were calculating a different set of numbers as runners passed each other on the course. Oberst had the number the Little Irish were looking for.

"I'm still in shock," Cumbo said long after the meet ended. "It's a great feeling." O

### Run to glory

# ■ McQuaid's cross-country win streak is history, but what a history it is.

Scholastic cross country doesn't have the athletic cachet of football or basketball, but this is a sport that requires endurance, discipline and team strategy.

And when a boys cross-country team takes off on a 31-year winning streak, as Brighton's McQuaid did, all should wrench themselves from their seats of leisure and stand in awe and amazement.

Winning for McQuaid cross country became so expected — 212 straight dual meets stretching back to the Richard Nixon administration — that the only way to crack the front page would be to lose. And so it happened. Aquinas defeated McQuaid by one point, ending the longest — when measured by years — streak in the nation.

McQuaid was gracious and generous in defeat; coach Bob Bradley remarked that Aquinas was a fitting conqueror, having come close four or five times in the past. But the pang of this loss for McQuaid is no doubt severe.

The team let no one down. Such an enormous burden of victory cannot be lifted forever. The story is the glorious, three-decade run, not the ending of it. October 23, 2002

TO: Members of the McQuaid Jesuit Varsity Cross-Country Team Gentlemen.

I know that you must feel great disappointment about the dual meet loss to AO yesterday, especially since it ended "the streak".

I was at the meet and watched you run great races. You have no reason to apologize for your performances. Those of us who have run cross-country, especially dual meets at Cobbs, know how difficult the race is. The cries of "What if" and "If only" usually come from those who refuse to enter the arena and engage in the competition. You can be very proud of the role you played in all of your wins that contributed to the 212 consecutive victories.

As I drove home from the meet, I reflected on our common legacy. I was a member, and the captain, of the McQuaid cross-country team that lost the last dual meet... in 1971, to a great AQ team.

More importantly, I was a member and the captain of the McQuaid team that began "the streak" with a dual meet victory in October 1971, shortly after that last loss. Little did we know then of the long and proud tradition we had a part in starting. You have that same opportunity.

Best of luck in the weeks ahead and on the start of a new streak!
