Harper's memory kept alive at McQuaid Invitational

For the first time in 10 years, there will be no Katie Harper Memorial 5km road race this fall. However, the memory of the former Fairport High School runner will be kept alive through the issuance of a plaque at the McQuaid Invitational Cross Country Meet on Oct. 2 at Genesee Valley Park.

Beginning this year, the Katie Harper Memorial Plaque will be awarded to the Section 5 girl that posts the fastest time of the day. Harper was just 17 when she was in a fatal car crash in February of 1994, just one day after competing in the Section 5 Indoor Track and Field Championships. That fall, local race director Bill Kehoe of the Cats AC along with Harper's father. Jerry, began a 5k road race in Fairport in Katie's memory with proceeds going to a memorial fund in her name. With considerable sponsorship dollars from Nike, for whom Jerry Harper works, and Dick's Clothing and Sporting Goods, the race was one of the most popular in the area and often times attracted some of the top names in American running, including two-time Olympian Suzy Favor-Hamilton.

The initiation of the Katie Harper Memorial Plaque to the fastest Section 5 girls of the day at the McQuaid Invitational comes just one year the meet began awarding the Charlie McMullen Memorial Plaque to the fastest Section 5 boys time of the day. Victor's Kyle Heath, now a freshman at the University of Syracuse, was that awards first recipient.

This year is the 40th edition of the McQuaid Invitational, which started as an eight-team 2.5-mile road race around the school's Brighton campus in 1965. This year, the meet is set to attract nearly 240 teams and 5000 runners from eight states and the Canadian province of Ontario.

The highlight of the eighthour, 24-race extravaganza should the AAA Boys Varsity race, schedule for 3:50 pm, which will feature two of the east's top teams, Fayetteville-Manlius of Section 3 (Syracuse) and Lockport of Section 6 (Buffalo) along with Lilburn, Georgia's Parkview HS, one of the Southeast's top teams.



has also expressed interest in competing as they, along with Parkview and many other top teams look to improve their regional rankings in hopes of being invited to the first Nike Team Nationals in Portland, OR on Dec. 4. The Nike Team Nationals will invite the nation's top 20 boys and 20 girls cross-country teams, to the first national high school team championship in any sport. The top two boys teams and two girls teams in each of eight regions, plus at-large selections, will earn nationals bids. The selections will be based on a new Nike Team Nationals regional rankings system.

McQuaid mudders slog to 5th at Wildcat

Derek Seber places 15th to lead the Knights.

McQuaid runners profess to be good mudders, even to liking slogging through the mucky stuff, but they were out-slogged by four other teams in their varsity race at the Wildcat Invitational last Saturday.

The sectional course at Marcus Whitman drew many of Section 5's best teams, and the Knights placed fifth out of 15 over a 5km course still soaked from Friday's all-day rain.

Sophomore Derek Seber ran another strong race to lead his team, placing 15th in a field of 110. His supporting scorers were seniors Nick Arazoza (23), Jamie Moynihan (35), and Dan Murphy (46), and junior Juan Habes (43). McQuaid's score of 161 placed it behind R-H 967), Penfield (97), HF-L (99) and Brighton (144).

The meet's other races were non-scoring and the Knights' slogging noticeably better. The Varsity-2 squad put five men into the top 22 of the 175-runner field for an unofficial

second place behind Penfield. Junior Martin Wegman took top slogging honors by finishing seventh, and senior Pat DePippo, who ran second for much of the race, hung on to take 10th. Soph Dan Plumeri (16), junior Peter Schwalm (17) and senior Andrew Hovey (22) completed the would-have-been scoring group.

McQuaid's junior high runners, armed with their newly learned "Simba" cheer, had first crack at the mud and took a substantial amount home with them. Forty-five strong, their white shirts dominated the front of the race in the early going, but would up placing an unofficial second to the black shirts of HF-L's Cougars. Eighthgrader Chris DiPasquale (4), and ninth-graders Trevor Bachman (9), Brian Sparacino (10), Ben Van Son (11), and Craig Hanna (16) gave the Knights their non-score.

This Saturday, the Knights will head east to Auburn for the annual Kiwanis Invitational at Holland Stadium, giving them a chance to see some Section 3 and Section 4 competition.

MCQ GROUP WINS EASILY AQ'S NOEL BATEMAN SETS COURSE RECORD

Cross Country

Nonleague

MCQUAID 20, AQUINAS 42

Noel Bateman of Aquinas ran the fastest time ever recorded on the City-Catholic League's cross country course at Cobbs Hill in a dual meet against archrival McQuaid.

Bateman's 16-minute, 13-second time was 20 seconds faster than the time of Dave Hryvniak of Aquinas, who ran a 16:33 in 2002 against McQuaid.

"He went out and took command, looked smooth and was strong the whole way," said Aquinas coach Ron Zimarino. "A lot of great runners have run on this course. Noel's time is truly remarkable, especially for a junior."

McQuaid coach Bob Bradley, whose team won easily, said only four or five individuals have ever broken 17 minutes on the 3.1-mile course, a layout with one hill in the first half that loops the reservoir and does not go into the Cobbs Hill woods. It's been used for the last 20 years for C-C meets.

Bradley said the fastest a McQuaid runner has ever covered the course was Joe Lamagna's 16:54.

"We knew he (Bateman) was really out for something," Bradley said, "when we timed him in five minutes for the first mile.

"He ran the second half of the course faster than the first."

McQuaid runners have week of 'tricks and treats'

East finally stops the Knights' streak.

Surprise, satisfaction, disappointment – last week's four meets had something for everyone connected with McQuaid cross country.

The grab bag opened on Tuesday with the Knights' Varsity-2 being upset by East 29-30, continued on Wednesday with an impressive 20-42 win over Aquinas, resumed on Friday with a victorious City-Catholic title run-off against East and Edison, and ended on Saturday with a two-point loss to Vestal in the Greenman Invitational.

The loss to East marked the first time McQuaid had suffered defeat against a Rochester city school in all 43 years of Bob Bradley's tenure as the Knights cross country coach.

With arch-rival Aquinas on tap the next day, McQuaid's Varsity-1 group wasn't available, but the Knights had handled that conflict many times in the past.

Bradley second-guessed himself, saying "I knew East had a good 1-2, but I thought we had enough good runners out there to pack in ahead of their third man. As it turned out, he killed us by running a great race and beating our whole team. I shouldn't have cut it that close."

The next day, the Knights were up for the Aquinas challenge and ran their best set of times at Cobbs since 1998 to win easily. Aquinas junior Noel Bateman stole the show, though, with a record-breaking individual effort, lowering the course mark by 20 seconds to 16:13.

McQuaid leader, sophomore Derek Seber, clocked a 17:20, fastest by a Knight runner in five years. Six more Knights broke 18 minutes – the most since their state champ did it in '92. Griffin Alford (17:41), Jamie Moyihan (17:42), Nick Arazoza (17:51), Tim Hanna (17:56) and Juan Habes (17:58) all finished ahead of Aquinas' No. 2 runner.

The loss to East occasioned a run-off for the City-Catholic title on Friday, and an augmented Varsity-2 came through with a winning group performance that topped the predictable 1-2's by East and Edison. Junior Mike Ansaldi (5), led the way, followed by Peter Schwalm (6), Martin Wegman (7), Mike Andrews (8), Tom Murray (9) and Jim Lappin (10).

Saturday, saw Varsity-1 take on the rugged Ely Park course in the 12-school Greenman Invitational and fall just short of a victory, 69-71, against Section 4's Vestal.

Seber (6), Arazoza (10), and Alford (11) had strong race, but the Knights group, down 36 seconds against Aquinas, slipped back to 52 seconds as Jamie Moynihan finished 21st and Dan Murphy 23rd.

McQuaid's only other entry

at Binghamton was an 11-man contingent from Coach Todd Stewart's junior high team. The young Knights ran well, losing 50-63, to an undefeated Binghamton squad, but defeating always-tough Ithacato take second among 10 schools.

Scoring for the Knights were eighth-graders Dominic Bozzelli (6), and Chris. DiPasquale (10), seventh-grader Jonathan Ritter (12) and ninth-graders Trevor Bachman (15) and Chris Sponn (20).

Heading into this Saturday's Section 5 championships at Marcus Whitman High's tough 5k course, McQuaid is ranked behind Rush-Henrietta, Penfield, Irondequoit, Churchville Chili and Fairport.

"R-H is a clear favorite, I, think," said Bradley, "but if we can get top races from our best five, we'll be right in there with the others."

This year, McQuaid is in Class AA, racing at 3:30 p.m.

McQuaid wins by one point

The Knights bring home the Jesuit Schools Cross Country Championship.

McQuaid's cross country team has had a 3-2 look (a lead cluster of three runners and a pair not too far behind) in most meets this season, and it finally found a winning version of that formula two Saturdays ago in New York City.

The Knights led with a 2-4-5 in the field of 63 runners and got just enough from their fourth and fifth men (25-28) to nip Gonzaga (D.C.) High School, 64-65, in the 60th running of the Jesuit Schools Championship at Van Cortlandt Park.

"Aside from 1963, when we won on a tie-breaker, that's the closest win we've had down here," said coach Bob Bradley, who's taken his Knights to New York 42 times and come home with 16 trophies.

"There were so many spots being changed in the last halfmile, I know we could have won or lost the meet with any of our five scorers. Just eye-

from where his runners last passed him was a late charge by junior Juan Habes and senior Jamie Moynihan that picked up about 10 places to squeak their team past Gonzaga and defending champion St. Joseph's of Philadelphia.

Up front, McQuaid showed its best since 1998, when it last won the meet. Senior Nick Arazoza, after a frustrating season of little improvement over his previous races, took a huge chunk of 72 seconds off his last year's time and ran 13:46 for the hilly 2.5mile VCP course.

Arazoza moved through the top 10 up to second and was going for the win in the final quarter mile. Kevin O'Hara, a lanky St. Joe's runner, used his longer stride to hold off Arazoza's kick, but sophomore Derek Seber finished strong to take fourth, and senior Griffin Alford's closing sprint brought him up to fifth.

Then it was up to Habes and Moynihan. Gonzaga's purple looked like winners with 3-6-10-12, but their fifth man struggled home in 34th. The tight victory more than offset a two-point loss to Vestal, 6971, in McQuaid's last invitational before sectionals. It also marked the first multischool meet win for the Knights since 2000.

In the meet's other two races, McQuaid's junior high squad ran its usual tight group race, but couldn't get it close enough to the front to offset the strength of St. Joe's and Fordham Prep. Eighth-grader Chris DiPasquale led the way in 10th place, and classmates Dominic Bozzelli and Matt DiDonna, plus freshmen Craig Hanna and Trevor Bachman all took top 25 medals. Freshman Ben Van Son and seventh-grader Jonathan Ritter, both consistent scorers during the season, were in the next group of finishers.

The Knights JV squad took a respectable third in the nineschool field, paced by a first from junior Peter Schwalm and strong races from Jim Lappin (16) and Alec Hurley (17, Martin Wegman (26) and Tom Murray (3) closed out the

scoring.

After getting the good news of their win, the Knights stuck around to cheer on former local champs Kyle Heath and Liz Cufari, both running for Syracuse University in the ECAC Championships.
