Third at Stow (Ohio) Bulldog Invitational (15:29.70, personal best). Won Clarence Invitational (15:52).

## McQuaid's fun-loving Glavin finishes on top

Sitting around a campfire in the lower Catskills at the end of a killer workout last summer, Donovan "Donny" Glavin and his McQuaid teammates kicked around a few goals they were working toward.

"Win sectionals again as a team," he said, "to make states, do well there and maybe do well at regionals. For me, same thing.

"Nationals was a stretch."

Check off all four now. After finishing 41st at the Nike Cross Nationals in Portland, Oregon, Glavin told his coach, Todd Stewart: "This is awesome. The greatest day of my life. I've accomplished everything I've dreamed of and more this season."

Glavin earned Runner of the Year honors on the *Democrat and Chronicle*'s 11th annual All-Greater Rochester cross country team of 14 boys by improving steadily in his senior season. Pittsford Mendon's third straight state title also earned coach Chris Compson his second straight coach of the year honor as well.

"It all started there at coach's Dingle camp," Glavin said of the location on Lower Dingle Hill Road in Delaware County. "We have an 1,800-meter hill there we call 'Rigor Mortis.' It's just ridiculous. All on a paved road. Three or four times harder than the course at states. We love it because it prepares us for anything."

Stewart said much of Glavin's late-season success — winning sectionals, finishing third at Class A states, winning Jesuits, placing fifth at Nike regionals and then nationals — is due to his easy-going, relaxed nature and fitness to withstand consecutive weeks of pounding among the best runners in the country, some right here in Section V.

"Week and a half before regionals, he trained with some of the Pittsford Mendon guys. That was very beneficial. But the toughest part," Stewart said, "was racing on his own at regionals and nationals. He thrives with his teammates."

Junior Joe Doerr, McQuaid's No. 2 man since Aidan Blake was sidelined with a back injury, said Glavin is "the best kind of a teammate. Donny's fun and serious at the same time. He's a leader. He's right there when we need him. If there's ever a problem, you can count on him to be a good teammate."

Doerr said he was watching the 199 runners line up at nationals, on live video,

and the camera suddenly stopped at Glavin.

"While everybody around him looks all serious and nervous, he snaps his fingers, smiles and points his index finger out with a thumbs up.

"That's Donny."
