Section 8 had a one-two-three finish in the shotput, a one-threefour in the long jump, one-twofour in the 60-yard dash, and a one-three in the long jump. All that spells just plain Domination, with a capital D.

The outcome of the high jump, which featured Section 8's Jay Meisler, who cleared 7-0 in a meet with the Russian Junior Team, and 6-11 in various meets on the Island, was over really before it began.
