## Kopf jumps to two records

# Walters' victories lead Penfield girls; Horton 3-for-3

The winning names were familiar — Penfield seventh-grader Deresa Walters ... East sprinter Lisa Horton ... McQuaid distance specialist Scott Paterson.

But the day belonged to Andie Kopf.
As the Spencerport junior prepared for her final attempt in the long jump in yesterday's Section 5 indoor track championships, her coach compared the similarities between this situation and the one Kopf faced a year ago.

In both cases, Kopf had gone down to her last attempt in a field event in second place. In tast year's triple jump event, she surpassed Alexander's Michele Galganski on her final try, an attempt of 35 feet-3 inches, which set a sectional mark while clinching the event for Kopf. Yesterday, at the University of Roches-

Yesterday, at the University of Rochester's Fieldhouse, it happened again. This time, the long jump and Penfield's Kari Cleveland were the obstacles.

"The similarities were amazing," Spencerport Coach Doug Schneider said.
"When Andie lined up for her final attempt (in the long jump), all I could think about was last year."

When it counted most yesterday, Kopf was true to the form that saw her break the state record in the triple jump in the first meet of the season, also at UR, with a leap of 38-3½. She set meet records in both the triple jump (37-1¾) and the long jump (18-4¾), and also finished second to East's Lisa Horton, the meet's outstanding female competitor, in the 45-

meter dash with a time of :6.1.

The top two finishers in each individual event and the top team in each relay qualify for Saturday's state meet at the Carrier Dome in Syracuse. Kopf, however, will only compete in the field events. She will skip the sprint.

"Three events is really tiring," the 16year-old said. "It makes the jumps

tougher."

Kopf was the easy winner in the triple jump, as runner-up Galganski was far behind at 34-6½. But in the long jump, Cleveland, who gave up basketball this year to try track, was more than equal to the task.

Both girls had jumped 17-4 in the preliminaries, meaning that the one with the next best distance would win. With one

attempt to go, Cleveland had a second-best leap of 17-3, while Kopf's next best was 16-11.

On her final attempt, Kopf shattered the tie between the two with her record

"I was terrified," said Kopf, the clear favorite in both field events. "I was tired and wasn't sprinting fast enough. I was just thinking that I had to get my speed up - and not fall. That was on my mind, too."

But all that fell were the records. Kopf's sectional marks were two of the six meet records broken or tied yesterday. The others, and some of the

meet's highlights:

• Penfield's Walters won the 3,000 run (10:17.7) and the 1,500 run (4:53.2), both sectional bests for the season, in leading the Chiefs to the girls' overall

Walters, 12, also ran on the winning 3,200 relay (10:34.3), along with Tracy Stage, Rachel Korn, and Roberts.

"I wasn't too nervous," said Walters, who stands 4-9 and weights 75 pounds. "I always figure I'll go out and give it my best shot."

The Penfield girls totaled 118 points, far ahead of runner-up East (73). Spencerport was third (63), followed by Alexander (55) and Newark (33).

In boys' team scoring, Brighton won with 66 points.

· Penfield's Sharon Roberts broke the 1,000-meter run record of 3:03.4, set last year by Brighton's Jennifer Shaver, by finishing in 2:59. She also finished second to East's Kelly Johnson in the 600 run. Both recorded times of 1:41.3, but officials awarded Johnson first.

• Horton tied the record for the 45meter dash with a :6.0 time for the fourth straight year. Alexander's Michele Mazurik also ran in :6.0 in 1980. Horton also won the 300-meter dash (:41.7) and was part of East's recordsetting 800 relay team (1:49.5), along with Johnson, Irene Evans and Charlotte Nesmith.

 Nesmith broke the record in the 40-meter hurdles, previously :6.6, in :6.5. Cleveland also came in at :6.5 but Nesmith was ruled the winner by track officials.

· Edison's Darrell Johnson was a double winner in the 45 (:5.6) and the 300 (:37.6).

• Paterson won the 1,000 (2:34.4) and 1,600 (4:29.7) runs and was selected the meet's outstanding male competitor.

• Franklin's Robert Porcha set a record in the triple jump (43-01/2), breaking the record of 42-7 set last year by Rush-Henrietta's Cornelius Southall and Brockport's Craig Kerley.

• Rush-Henrietta's Greg Ellis won the 40-meter hurdles (:5.9) and the 600 run (1:28).

 Galganski, of Alexander, edged Debbie Derks of Newark for first place in the high jump (5-3 to 5-2).
