Vaulter Ellis gets Olympian's boost

An Olympic champion quietly joined the crowd at RIT's Gordon Field House on Friday night when freshman Erica Ellis of Gates Chili began her pole vaulting routines.

Few knew.

While Ellis' GC coaches — head coach John Driscoll and vault coach Bob Bartula — provided the pointers, Jenn Suhr and her coach/husband, Rick, stood proudly back and watched their protégé win in a breeze at Section V's Meet of Champions, the qualifying meet for the state indoor track meet next week at Cornell.

"It's always great to have their support," said Ellis, who trains with Jenn at the Suhrs' home-based facility in Riga. "Coach Bartula and I decided I'd start at 11 feet, be relaxed and just have fun. I'd already made state qualifying height (her seasonbest is 12 feet, 4 inches, set at the Rochester Relays) so it was like the pressure was off."

After clearing 11-9, Ellis was done. A quick hug and Jenn and Rick were out the door.

"I am so fortunate to have excellent coaches around me," Ellis said. "I can't wait to get to states. That is going to be so exciting."

Last week at sectionals Ellis took a shot at the Section V record as the clock passed midnight. She stretched the meet to almost 1 a.m. trying to top 12-6, but missed on three tries.

she landed a record long jump of 20-3, No. 3 in the country.

Watson added a victory in the 1,000 (2:46.77) to go along with her 1:29.53 600 that broke her own record of 1:30.08 set three weeks ago ...

Senior sprinter Kelly Brown of Wilson Magnet swept the 55 (6:46) and 55 hurdles (7.41) while the meet's fourth double-winner was Anthony Butler of Letchworth, capturing both jump events—long (23-21/4) and triple (47-101/2).

"Every other meet or so," she said, "I try to break the record. Not today. This was just about qualifying for states.'

Three section V records fell, two at the feet of Rush-Henrietta's sensational sophomore Lanae-Tava Thomas and another by her junior teammate, Sammy Watson.

Thomas shocked herself with a time just .23 seconds off the all-time high school record in a preliminary heat 55-meter dash.

"I can't believe it," she screamed, dancing into the arms of her teammates with an incredulous "did I just do that in the prelims?" look on her face. When her time of 6.83 was announced as a new national season-leading mark, and Section V record, athletes and spectators gave her a standing ovation. Her previous record was set Dec. 30 at Houghton College.

"I had a really good start out of the blocks and strode through all the way," she said. "I had no idea it would be that fast. I wasn't expecting that."
