Rush-Henrietta sophomore Thomas continues to soar

Rush-Henrietta sophomore Lanae-Tava Thomas could see big things for herself in track and field as she grew older.

That bright future may have arrived ahead of her schedule, as Section V's fastest sprinter among high school girls is on the national scene now.

Thomas won three events Thursday night during the Section V Class A/B Indoor Track Championships, including a record long jump at Rochester Institute of Technology during another dominant performance by the Rush-Henrietta girls team.

A jump of 20 feet, 2 1/2 inches by Thomas topped the Section V record she set Jan. 16 at The College at Brockport during the Trent Jackson/Cedric Walker Invitational. (/story/sports/high-school/2016/01/16/sammywatson-leads-indoor-track-record-breakers/78809110/) She also ran the 55-meter dash in 6.95 seconds and triple-jumped 36-1/2, which are short of earlier performances that have her on top of the area's leaderboard.

Thomas set the 55 girls sectional record of 6.90 on Dec. 30 at Houghton College. That is No. 1 in the nation,

according to DyeStat.com. (http://www.dyestat.com/)

"It's really fun," Thomas said. "I didn't expect to do this good, this year. I was thinking maybe junior year, maybe senior year. To do this as a sophomore is really fun.

"It's just my body motivating me to go further than what I actually think I can do. Just doing the workout, then coming here and doing really good lets me know that it's actually working. So, I should just go and do better."

Not many individuals have performed better this season than Thomas and junior world outdoor champion Sammy Watson, who won the Class A girls 1,000 and 1,500. They and their Rush-Henrietta teammates have cast a long shadow over other strong performers this winter.

"It's been a good day for R-H," Rush-Henrietta senior sprinter Tori Thompson said as the Royal Comets ran away with the Class A team title with 187 points. "Everyone is (setting personal records), and if not, at least placing (and earning points for the team).

"I think we came here to win. We know we can do it."

Webster Thomas junior Natalie Neamtu finished second to Watson in the Class A 1,000 and 1,500.

"She's going to be out there," Neamtu said as she waved her hand with a smile. "It's been a good year. I've accomplished my main goal, making it to nationals in the Emerging Elite 800 and the mile.

"I kind of tune her out. Today, she kind of dragged me along, so it was helpful. She's a whole another level."

There were times that Fairport senior Michael Mallow was unsure of how he would perform this winter. It's been a tough school year.

"I've been injured all year," he said. "I had a concussion, a torn tendon in my (left) ankle, then I had IT Band syndrome (overuse injury).

"Yeah, it's been a rough year."

Those injuries and that amount of discomfort can put a crimp into training, but there was Mallow winning the Class A 1,000 in a personal-best time of 2:32.85. He also ran a leg on Fairport's first-place 3,200 relay that beat the runner up by about 7.57 seconds.

Now there are plans for Mallow to run in the Emerging Elite division 800 at the national indoor meet in New York City after the state championships.

"I was worried that I wouldn't be able to compete where I wanted to compete," Mallow said. "I knew I'd be racing but I just wasn't sure if it was as well as I wanted to do."

Penfield junior Brad Farnham said he surprised himself during the Class A 1,600, a race he covered in 4:25.99, fast enough to beat McQuaid's Donny Glavin, the Class A 3,200 champion.

"It's a PR by like four or five seconds," Farnham said. "So a big PR. I don't know, I just felt it. Going around the last two laps, I was like, 'All right, I gotta go.' and then Donny passed me. It was, 'All right, I'm not letting him take this.

"He always beats me."

McQuaid senior Tobi Tella leaped to the top of the Section V boys long jump leaderboard when he went out 23-7 ½. Tella also won the Class A triple jump, to join sprinter teammate Noah Williams as a double sectional class individual champion.

Those were part of McQuaid's effort to win the Class A boys team title. Greece Arcadia won the Class B boys team title.

There are two Section V champions at the dinner table of the Morrow family in North Greece.

Amaya Morrow, a sophomore at Hilton, won the Class A girls 55 hurdles in 8.99. Seconds earlier, Alana Morrow, a senior, led a one-two finish doe Mercy when she crossed the finish line after 8.47 seconds in the Class B final.


"We were one-two (on the Section V leaderboard) most of the season," Alana Morrow said.

"It feels amazing to win," Amaya Morrow said. "I'm happy I did it with my sister, in her senior year."

Pittsford Sutherland junior Annie Hanna won the Class B girls 300 and and 600. The team title came down to the final event, the girls pole vault, a contest that was in its early stages as of 10:45 p.m.

Purple reigns supreme at track championships

ITHACA – What a perfectly purple day for sophomore Lanae.

Lanae-Tava, that is. Luh-NAY.

And don't forget the TAY-vuh, or mom and dad, Michelle and Lance Thomas, will not be happy. Dad picked Lanae, mom Tava, and "the hyphen's important, too," Lanae-Tava Thomas laughed, explaining how everyone seems to mess up her

Bouncing around Cornell University's Barton Hall, giddy in the moments, the newly crowned three-

time state indoor track gold medalist from Rush-Henrietta was drawing as much attention for her purple headband and jumbo-twist ponytail Saturday as she was for defending her 55-meter dash title, winning the long jump a few minutes later and then helping her R-H 800 relay to gold.

"It's all so exciting," Thomas said, trying to hold down her exuberance that she explains away with "it's me!"

"Coach gets so mad at me sometimes, but I like to be a little different. I just thought, since purple was Section V's color, and I'm representing the section, why not wear some purple?"

With seven gold medals and 30 medals overall, Section V's girls colored Cornell University's 101-year-old indoor track barn with dominant performances, finishing a close second to Section I for the overall section title. The boys added another gold as Kelly Brown captured the 55, and earned 37 medals overall to make it the most impressive showing since Section V's first appearance at indoor states, in 1975.

"They came through big-time," said state girls chairman and Penfield coach Dave Hennessey. "Incredible performance."

The Rochester area's state champions:

- ·Thomas, 55 and long jump.
- "I've kicked kids off the team for dying their hair," said Mike DeMay, rolling his eyes and grinning like maybe it was a joke, or maybe not, as Thomas climbed up the podium to accept her medals.
- "Oh no, "Lanae-Tava said when she heard of that. "I wouldn't have ever done it if I thought that might happen.

It took my mom and I eight hours last Saturday to do it."

"Today I had the bounce and I had the energy," Thomas said. "This is what I love to do. Bring on the nationals."

- •R-H junior Sammy Watson, who equaled Thomas' haul with individual golds in the 600 and 1,000, and the gold 800 relay.
- •Freshman Erica Ellis of Gates Chili, who leaped 12 feet, 3 inches in the pole vault, three inches better than second place.
- •Midlakes senior Aubrianna "Bri" Lantrip, who reached 5-8 in the high jump despite a sore right foot that forced her to withdraw from the triple jump. "Fortunately, I push off with my right leg in the high jump," she said.
- •Wilson Magnet senior Brown, who won the 55 but finished two-hundredths of a second out of first in the 55 hurdles after Isaiah Brown (no relation) of Pittsford Sutherland false-started.

The head-to-head matchup of Watson and Suffern's Kamryn McIntosh, ranked 1-2 in the nation, brought the capacity crowd of 4,800 to a screaming frenzy in the 600. Watson passed McIntosh on the far turn at 400 meters and pulled steadily away.

"We were trying not to make it a "me against her" match," McIntosh said as Watson nodded affirmation. "We're just looking to run good times." Watson clocked 1:30.59, about a second above her national best 1:29.53 and .45 off her Section V record. McIntosh ran 1:34.43. Her best is 1:31.00.

The false start in the 55 hurdles unsettled Brown just enough to make the difference in achieving his sprint double.

"Isaiah had a slight hitch, just enough to false start," he said. "Twice, actually. It made me hold back a tiny bit the second time. I didn't want to false start myself in the finals.

"I'm so glad I got the 55. I'm looking forward to running three events (60, 60 hurdles and 200) at nationals next week."

Section V's boys pole vault contingent swept the 2-3-4 positions, with Terry Taylor of Greece Olympia (14-3), Jack Smith of Webster Schroeder (14-0) and Nathan Crane of Letchworth (13-6) earning medals.

Sprinters Alpha Berry of Greece Olympia and Tori Thompson of R-H were honored as Section V's sportsmanship award winners.
