

# Scholastic track records smashed

When the onslaught was finished during the second annual Scholastic Invitational Track Meet at Manley Field House yesterday, seven of the eight marks set last year were smashed.

CBA, who won the meet again with 24 points, owned one of the records thanks to Marty Robb, who broke his own two-mile mark of 10:21.5 with a 10:02.8 and with no one pushing him.

Westhill was second with 16 points yesterday, while Oswego was third with 14, Ithaca fourth with 12 and McQuaid fifth with 10.

It was McQuain's Eric Kendrick who made one of the day's most impressive show-uses. He slashed the old 1:18.2 record in the 600-yd. run with a 1:14. It was his third Manley Field House record. He had earlier set marks in the mile and the 100-yd. run.

Yesterday's mile was won by Potsdam's Steve Wray who topped the 4:39.5 Meet mark set

by Oswego's Don Colloca last while second-place Dennis Powers of CBA also bettered the old time.

Oswego's Rick McCann set another meet mark in the 1000, finishing in 2:19.9 to top the old 2:25.0 while Ithaca's Oscar Cooper won the 160-yd. dash in 17.4 after he and CBA's Brian DeJoseph had set meet records of 17.3 in the heats.

Hundstad, Jim Prockup and Dave Fiachetti set a new mile relay time of 3:42.8, bettering McQuade's 3:35.0 while Henninger's Tony Capria, John Franke Marco Antinarella and Paul Fisher broke the 640-yd. relay mark with a 1:09.3.

The standing 1:13.5 was bettered by the following three finishers: Westhill, Liverpool and

The only non-record-setting event was the sprint medley really won by McQuaid with Steve Fahy, John Compolieto, Dave Dunn and Charlie Maier running. Their time was 3:34.5.

Steve Barone of Oswego easily won the non-scoring novif 880 in 2:10.6.

The same teams, now finished with the indoor season in Section III, will run next Saturday at 1:30 p.m. in the Ithaca Invi-

## Kendrick Sets Mark In Scholastic 600

SYRACUSE — Slender Eric Kendrick, McQuaid High's lanky track ace, smashed another Section 3 schoolboy record here yesterday as he ran the 600 in 1:14.0 in the second annual Scholastic Invitation at Syracuse University's Manley Field House.

The meet was sponsored by the coaches association of the Section 3 area.

Earlier this winter, Kendrick erased standards in the 1000-yard run by clocking a 2:17.6 and the mile by running a 4:24.2.

Yesterday, Kendrick grabbed the lead midway through the 600-yard test and came home a winner by 40 yards, four seconds under the previous record time for the indoor distance.

McQuaid also had a winner in the sprint medley relay, coming from behind on Chuck Maier's half-mile anchor leg to win in

3:31.5. Maier did 2:06.0 in the half-mile portion of the sprint medley after a blazing 160-yard leg of 16.7 seconds by Dave Dunn had kept the Black Knights close. Steve Fahy and John Compolieto handled the first two legs for McQuaid.

McQuaid's Bob Wafer won the freshman mile in record time of 5:06.6, Bob Lawrence was second in the freshman 880 and Pat Love sixth in the two-mile.

McQuaid's indoor cindermen will compete in another Section 3 invitation next Saturday at Cornell University, Ithaca.
