Brighton, Newark win girls' titles; boys' undecided

First, East High's Yauneek Jackson got mad. Then she got better in the 100meter high hurdles.

"When I started, Charlotte (Nesmith, also of East) was really good," Jackson recalled. "She'd get a lot of compliments." But they passed me by. That would make me sort of mad, and I took my anger out in the hurdles."

Jackson, who is only a sophomore, took her anger out on the Section 5 record yesterday at the Class A championship track meet at Brockport State. It was one of five records broken or equaled by East

• Jackson lowered the record in the 100 hurdles by one-tenth of a second in a semifinal heat (:15.1), then lowered it one-tenth more in the final (:15.0).

"I felt like I was being pushed," she said after finishing a half-second ahead of classmate Nesmith.

• Lisa Horton, a junior, improved her own time by one-tenth of a second in the 100 by winning in :11.7. She also won the 200 in :24.3.

"When I first came here I was so scared," she said, "because they had Cassie (Jordan of Pittsford) ranked ahead of me in the 100 and Tracy Watts (of Rush-Henrietta) ahead of me in the 200. It was like, I have to beat them."

• Ken Burke eclipsed the 14-year-old time of Gates-Chili's Bill O'Connell by two-tenths of a second in the 200 by winning in :21.0.

"When I got here I saw it was a nice day with no breeze and I knew it was right," the senior said. "Then when I ran
