# Disappointments now. but losses preparing Martin Ellis for states

First, there was disbelief, Rush-Henrietta hurdler Martin Ellis had been beaten. Not once. But twice in the same day.

Then came the grief from friends and

"Martin could get his head through the doorways at school this week," one of them joked Saturday at the 22nd annual Aquinas Relays.

Section 5's previously-undisputed hurdling champion lost to East's Ken Burke in the 110-meter highs and to Penfield's Mike McCarter in the 400 intermediates May 4 at the His and Hers Invitational.

"At first it was a major shock," Ellis said, recalling the upset losses. "But then I thought about it and I decided it's to my benefit.

"I'm getting state meet competition before I get to the states. In past years, I've won easily all season. Then, when I got to the states, I wasn't ready. This should help."

Ellis, a 10-time sectional titlist who is bound for Division I Western Michigan on a track scholarship, did not place outdoors in the state championships last season. His toughest area competition came from his own household — younger brother Greg.

Now, he is being pushed by Burke and McCarter.

In fact, he is chasing those two seniors. Burke equaled the Section 5 record and posted the state's best reported time this season (:14.0) in defeating Ellis. McCarter also used the state's best time (:54.8) to defeat the R-H senior.

Ellis' personal records are :14.2 in the highs and :55.4 in the intermediates.

Martin put the previous weekend's losses behind him Saturday by tripling at the Aguinas Relays. He was a member of the winning shuttle hurdles, long jump and 1.600 relay teams.

His long jump of 21 feet, 7½ inches put him in the top five among area competitors and helped R-H set a meet record of 62-93/4. He and brother Greg, Rod Poole and Cornelius Southall then

combined to tie the Section 5 record in the 1,600 relay (3:20.6).

"I just came out here to see what I could do," said Martin, "And have some

There was plenty of fun in the sun at the University of Rochester's Fauver Stadium as six Aquinas Relays records were broken. Included was a 400 relay run by East's Darnell Dunbar, Terry Richards. Burke and LaVonne Richards that established a Section 5 mark (:41.8).

Burke, who also has the state's best time in the 200 (:21.1), said the relay is most important to him.

"I know I can go to the states in the 200 and 110 hurdles," he said, "But with the relay, four guys can go. My teammates can go. More people can get to see what the states are all about.

"Last year, LaVonne and I went to the states alone. We were bored. We missed our other two teammates."

Dunbar, Burke and LaVonne Richards have been missing Terry Richards most of this season. Terry was sidelined by a kidney problem and had not run in the 400 relay prior to Saturday's.

AROUND SECTION 5: The baseball rematch between top-ranked Cardinal Mooney (16-2) and No. 2 Aguinas (14-2) scheduled vesterday at Silver Stadium was postponed by rain. The two City-Catholic League teams will play either Wednesday or Thursday.

Greg Nicolay's two-run single helped Bishop Kearney (5-4 league, 8-9 overall) open a 5-0 lead en route to a 9-3 victory over McQuaid (6-3, 11-6) vesterday at Silver. The City-Catholic League contest was shortened to 51/2 innings by rain.

McQuaid remains the top-ranked team in boys' track after placing second behind Brooklyn Tech at the Aguinas Relays. Both teams finished with 34 points and one first place. But Brooklyn Tech won the tiebreaker for the team title by having two second places to defending champion McQuaid's one.

"We were trying to make the numbers add up differently," said Coach Bill Quinlisk, who is a math teacher at McQuaid. "But we couldn't."

Penfield still is top-ranked among area girls' track teams, Fairport is the No. 1 club in girls' softball, Pittsford Mendon is top rated in tennis, and Fairport is No. 1 among lacrosse team. The Red Raiders' lacrosse standing will be challenged, however, by No. 2 Irondequoit at 4 p.m. Thursday at Fairport.
