

Track champs come full circle

R-H, Mendon girls; McQuaid, Brockport boys win

Something materialized on Saturday that finally stopped the Rush-Henrietta girls track and field team this spring.

Yet, the thunder showers over the Section V Class AA-A Championships at Penfield eventually went away, so the Royal Comets' drive for another team championship was really only paused for 2 hours and 25 minutes.

The Rush-Henrietta girls were again runaway winners, as their 170 points topped runner-up Fairport by 84, despite being shorthanded because athletes had other commitments, in-

cluding junior Sammy Watson. The IAAF girls 400-meter dash junior world champion ran at the Prefontaine Classic meet in Oregon.

"We try really hard for championship season, and we try really hard for everything," Rush-Henrietta senior sprinter Tori Thompson said. "We train in every type of weather and I feel like that helps.

"It's important to us that we always give 110 percent, even when we know that we can do better than most of the competition or when we know that it's cold and that we probably won't do well anyway. You always go out with the inten-
